Marti Ives Salad Dressing

Basil Vinaigrette

- 2 C fresh basil firmly packed leaves
- 1 tsp minced garlic
- 2 Tbsp chopped shallot or red onion
- 3 Tbsp red wine vinegar
- 3 tsp. salt
- 3 C extra virgin olive oil

Remove all the stems from the basil (stems are bitter) Wash and dry the basil leaves then place them into a blender

add all ingredients and blend on high speed for 30 seconds or until smooth

Taste and adjust seasoning as necessary.


